**Minutes of the Meeting**

The third Board of Studies (BoS) meeting for the Department of Economics at HL College of Commerce was conducted online on 16th April 2025, under the chairpersonship of Dr. Radha P. Tiwari. The meeting focused on three key agenda points: a review of previously approved Economics courses offered under Interdisciplinary/Multidisciplinary (ID/MD) grant-in-aid undergraduate programmes, a discussion on evaluation criteria, and the collection of academic inputs and suggestions from members. The meeting was attended by Dr. Hetal Choksi, Dr. Sangeeta Ghate, Dr. Kishor Bhanushali, Dr. Hitesh Thakkar, and CA Achal Agrawal.

During the course review, members expressed satisfaction with the structure and relevance of the current syllabi but emphasized the need for greater application-oriented learning. It was strongly recommended that more case-based content be integrated into course modules to foster critical thinking and real-world understanding among students. Examples from contemporary economic events, business practices, and policy frameworks are to be embedded as teaching tools. It was also agreed that new topics such as digital finance, behavioral economics, and sustainability economics be gradually introduced through electives or modules.

In discussing evaluation, a 40:60 ratio for internal and external assessment was proposed, with a focus on continuous internal evaluation. Members advised including diverse assessment methods such as presentations, data-based assignments, open-book tests, and simulation-based learning.

**Action Taken:** It was resolved that the syllabus will be updated to reflect these inputs by incorporating more application-based topics and case studies starting from the next academic session.

**All updated syllabus for B Com Sem 1” Economics for Business Decision making, BCom sem II Introduction to Macro Finance and BCom semester 03 Global Economic Governance has been approved by BOS committee.**
